

UPCOMING MINISTRY EVENTS

Gleb's Story

October 1

We will present a two-day Art of Renewal seminar in Moldova for the sports ministry team from Transnistria. Mission Eurasia's Alexandr Belev will lead the event.

October 2

Our team will open the new School Without Walls (SWW) center in Yerevan, Armenia. This is the first SWW center to open under the umbrella of the Missionary Baptist Union of Armenia.

October 9

We will present a youth conference, Time to Serve, in Tbilisi, Georgia, which will launch the new SWW year throughout the country.

October 7-9

We will open new SWW centers among unreached people groups in the republics of Kabardino-Balkaria and North Ossetia in Russia.

October 22-24

We will partner with the evangelical forum, Founders, in Moscow, Russia. The three-day event is expected to draw around 300 leaders, who will discuss holistic mission and church planting. Ministry materials and Scripture also will be distributed at the event.

Gleb remembers going to church with his mother and joining the praise and worship band and playing drums. But last year, the 17-year-old from Vitebsk, Belarus got mixed up with the wrong crowd, made some mistakes, and landed himself in jail. After Gleb was released, he stayed away from church, and continued to make bad choices.

In January, church friends approached him and invited him to come back to God and turn his life around. They prayed with him, and he soon cut ties with old friends who were bad influences on him, returned to church, and began playing in the worship band again.

This summer, he helped Mission Eurasia's School Without Walls (SWW) leaders as a sports instructor at one of their camps. One leader shared, "He was great in the camp, leading all the games and helping us with everything. But the most important thing was when Gleb got baptized on the last day of the camp!"

With your prayers and support, we are seeing young SWW leaders, like Gleb, being transformed, equipped, and trained for ministry.

We are preparing to reach 125,000 children with the story of Christ's birth and the hope of salvation in 10 countries of Eurasia.</p>

Pray more young people will put their trust in Christ and grow in their faith.</p>	<p>17 Pray for the church in Ak-Dovurak, Russia and that the congregation will find a minister who can faithfully lead the church.</p>	<p>18 Pray for those impacted by ongoing political, economic and other ministry challenges in Belarus. Pray believers will continue to push forward in ministry.</p>	
<p>19 Pray for the SWW program launching in the city Baranovichi, Belarus. Pray for ministry growth and that Next Generation leaders will serve as a bridge between their communities and churches.</p>	<p>20 Please continue to pray for home groups that have begun this fall throughout Eurasia, specifically those focused on outreach toward non-Christian young people.</p>	<p>21 Pray for outreach ministry efforts in Central Asian countries like Kazakhstan, where Christians face ongoing restrictions. Pray that young Next Generation leaders will find creative ways to serve the Lord amid persecution.</p>	<p>22 Please pray as we partner with the evangelical forum, Founders, in Moscow, Russia. The three-day event is expected to draw around 300 leaders, who will discuss holistic mission and church planting. We also will distribute books and Scripture at the forum.</p>
<p>23 Pray as we launch 25 SWW centers in cities of different regions of the Caucasus, Asia, and Russia. These are new areas where we have never started SWW programs before.</p>	<p>24 Pray for families that are being torn apart by divorce. A church leader in Minsk, Belarus said the number of families experiencing relationship issues and those dealing with divorce appears to be on the rise.</p>	<p>25 We praise the Lord for continued prayers as ministry efforts progress in remote, mountainous areas of eastern Siberia and other challenging areas of Eurasia.</p>
