Dear Friend,

Sometimes it seems as if circumstances are working to thwart God’s purposes. But that’s an illusion—because *God’s work cannot be stopped*. We’ve seen that demonstrated over and over during the past year.

During that time, Eurasia has experienced a succession of challenging events: the Covid pandemic, the continuing threat of war, economic upheaval, and social unrest.

The pandemic caused many people to retreat from public interactions, which would seem to hinder ministry activities. But God always finds a way to reach people. During this difficult time, He is using the internet and a wealth of online resources to do what can’t be done in person.

Christians are still being persecuted in Muslim-dominant countries. Even nominally Christian countries are singling out evangelical believers for harassment. But this opposition always causes God’s church to grow.

Likewise, war and turmoil in Ukraine, Armenia, and Azerbaijan have disrupted normal activities there. But that means our ministry to people who are suffering and spiritually hungry is needed now more than ever.

In fact, *it’s in the darkest places that God’s light shines the brightest*.

As we’ve fought against spiritual opposition from all directions, I’m reminded of God’s promise to the Israelites: “No weapon that is fashioned against you shall succeed, and you shall refute every tongue that rises against you in judgment. This is the heritage of the servants of the LORD and their vindication from me, declares the LORD” (Isaiah 54:17).

We are persevering because of God’s faithfulness—and the generous support of partners like you. As you read this report about the accomplishments of our young Christian leaders, I hope you’ll rejoice with me and “ascribe greatness to our God,” knowing that “His work is perfect, for all His ways are justice” (Deuteronomy 32:3-4).

We are committed to working with God to train the Next Generation of believers, empowering them to take the gospel to the ends of the earth. Through a variety of ministries operating throughout Eurasia, God is raising up men and women of faith to represent Him in a desperate world.

In addition to in-person learning, SWW hosted **300 students** in online groups, bringing the total number of students to **1,585**. We were gratified to see hundreds of these young leaders complete their two-year course.

There are many people who are hungry for God but who would never enter a church building. They can still receive the gospel from committed believers who share their faith in their work environment. **The Next Generation Professional Leaders Initiative (NGPLI)** trains Christians to shine the light of God’s truth in the marketplace and professional world. The result is a harvest of new believers from many professional fields and walks of life.

In the past year, 16,100 young professionals received training in the following categories:

- Medical/healthcare **4,100**
- Education **3,600**
- Law **1,900**
- Business **3,700**
- Science and Technology **2,800**

NGPLI also conducted:

- **19** training events
- **6** conferences
- **2** forums
- **7** roundtables

CHURCH PLANTING

SWW is establishing churches where the need is greatest.

Many places in Eurasia lack a strong local church presence. SWW is establishing new Christian congregations wherever there is opportunity, providing an environment for new believers to grow and thrive.

Over the past year, SWW workers planted 20 new churches.

We also held **31 church-planting seminars** with **715 people** participating, including **550 SWW students**, **100 church planters**, and **65 pastors**.

FAMILY AS MISSION

Over the past year, SWW held 23 major events through our Family as Mission program, training 3,839 people.

REACHING THE UNREACHED WITH THE GOSPEL

Hundreds of people groups are still waiting for the Good News.

It's estimated that **6,671** people groups in the world have never heard the Good News of Jesus Christ. And **373** of them are in the former Soviet Union and Israel. We're trying to reach as many of them as we can, obeying our Lord's command to, *“Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit”* (Matthew 28:19).

Our efforts last year took us to such remote places as Buryatia and Tuva in Siberia, where people mix Buddhist teachings with traditional pagan beliefs. Even in the twenty-first century, they've had little exposure to the Christian gospel. From our outposts there we can reach more people groups, including the Soyots to the south and the Evenks to the north.

When we go into new areas, we endeavor, like the Apostle Paul, to raise up leaders who can carry on the work after we're gone. We're grateful to God that He has made that possible in the places we've ministered.

And the Good News continues to spread—into the unreached areas of the world.



“While participating in street evangelism, my sister Larisa and I were standing by an apartment building. There we met an elderly Buryat woman named Darima with whom we shared the gospel. Even though this woman was rude to us at first, after Larisa spoke to her in Buryat and pulled out a gospel booklet written in Buryat, her attitude completely changed. She listened to the gospel and immediately accepted Jesus as her Savior! Then she invited us to her home so she could ask us questions about Christ. Now, we regularly talk to her, and she recently shared that she wants to get baptized.”

SPREADING GOD'S WORD FAR AND WIDE

There is nothing more important than reaching people with God’s Word. SWW has always made this a priority, but it has become more challenging with the arrival of the Covid pandemic. Yet as we have discovered, God always makes a way.

Yekaterina is a teacher of business English who loves talking to her students about God. With the Covid lockdowns she began teaching online and was searching for some resources that would help. She came across the Scriptures in Russian and English offered by Mission Eurasia. “And I instantly knew that they were an answer to my prayers,” she says. “I ordered some copies and sent them to my students. They are great for teaching English. And also, when people receive this gift via mail, they don’t have to think what other students will think. They become more open, and gladly read the gospel.”

“One of my students, Tatiana, started asking me a lot of questions. I answered them as much as I could. She was very worried about Covid affecting her health and the health of her loved ones. I don’t even know how it happened, but one day we prayed together for the first time. Then we read the gospel and prayed together for the next few months. When the churches opened up, Tatiana gladly came to my church and now she has been baptized and is God’s daughter.”

Gift of Hope

All children love to receive gifts; it makes them feel special—as they truly are, to God. Our Gifts of Hope brought that feeling to thousands of children over the past year, brightening their lives with the hope of Christmas. SWW workers traveled the snowy mountains of Abkhazia, the windswept plains of Mongolia and Siberia, and the war-torn villages of Nagorno-Karabakh to bring these packages of joy to grateful children.



A child who opens a Gift of Hope discovers an array of delights—toys, sweets, warm mittens, socks, school materials, hygiene supplies, and scriptural resources. Children and their families also receive the best gift of all—the good news of salvation through Jesus Christ.

This year, we reached **126,500 children** in **12 countries** with Gifts of Hope. In the process, we impacted more than **375,000 people**, including children, family members, neighbors, and others.

Summer Bible Camp

As the spiritual darkness deepens over much of Eurasia, our summer Bible camp ministry has taken on more urgency and importance.

At camp, the children—many of them innocent victims of war, poverty, and abuse—find a haven of love and peace. They can fellowship with other kids in a safe, wholesome environment while they learn the important truths of the Christian faith. They experience Christ’s love in action through the care and attention of our trained counselors. And they partake in something all kids need—*fun*.

For those who can’t get away for a whole week, we offer day camps, weekend camps, and other special events for specific groups.

Rudik and Julietta



Jesus felt compassion for the suffering people around Him and helped them in practical ways. Besides preaching to them, He healed their sicknesses and gave them food to eat. Through our **I Care** ministry to the suffering, we seek to follow our Lord's example, serving people's physical as well as spiritual needs. And there are so many places in Eurasia where this work is needed!

Christians are being cruelly persecuted in many countries, including some that are nominally Christian. In Muslim-dominant countries, extremists continue to terrorize believers. In other countries, social unrest caused by political corruption, poverty, and the Covid pandemic have made life difficult for millions. And the horrors of war are still fresh in Ukraine, Armenia, and Azerbaijan.



Rudik and **Julietta** had been married for more than 40 years and enjoyed their comfortable life in Nagorno-Karabakh. But everything changed with the outbreak of war. They were forced to board a bus with other residents and leave “for a few days,” as they were told. But their land was seized by Azerbaijan and their exile became permanent.

Settling in a new town, Rudik and Julietta heard about a local church that was aiding refugees like them. They asked for help and were soon visited by a group of Christians who brought a large box filled with food. That was the beginning of a spiritual journey that brought them to true faith in Jesus.

“I believe now,” Rudik says. “The time has come for us to believe. We have to believe...”

Julietta describes how their lives have changed: “We had faith, but we didn't know the Bible. I am so happy and grateful that [Christian] people [came] to visit us, helped us, prayed for us, and shared more about God. They have become like our own brothers and sisters in these past few months.”

This is the legacy of the **I Care** ministry to refugees that is bringing faith and hope to countless people in desperate circumstances.
