BRINGING TRUTH AND HOPE THROUGH GOD'S WORD

In the book of Amos, the prophet describes a terrifying time of famine—"Not a famine of food or a thirst for water, but a famine of hearing the words of the LORD" (Amos 8:11).

That is what we see now in many parts of the former Soviet Union, now known as Eurasia. Even though Christianity was introduced here centuries ago, millions of people across this vast region have never read a single Bible verse. And tragically, they've never heard the saving message of the gospel.

The countries of Eurasia now still bear the effects of seven decades of atheistic communism. In many central Asian countries, Islam is the only recognized religion. And even in places where the institutional church is strong, people often remain unaffected and indifferent.

They all need the wonderful liberating message of Christ's love and redemption through God's Word.

Over the past several decades, Mission Eurasia has distributed millions of pieces of Christian literature to the spiritually hunger people of Eurasia. **But the job is not done.** Millions more need to receive the life-giving message of the Word of God.

This is why Mission Eurasia is working to bring the Scriptures and Christian literature to people throughout Eurasia and beyond. New Testaments, Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, children's Bibles, and other Christian resources in native languages have been distributed in 14 countries of Eurasia and Israel.

The impact of our Scripture distribution program has been dramatic and rewarding. Tatiana's story (over) is just one illustration.



A Message of Hope in a Time of Anguish

People experiencing the horrors of war have a special need for the message of hope found in the Scriptures.

Tatiana was living in Gorlovka, Ukraine, with her husband Vitaly and their two daughters when Russia's full-scale invasion began. Soon, Vitaly left to fight for his country. Two weeks later, Tatiana received the terrible news that he had been killed. So she fled with her two daughters to the village of Granitnoye where her mother lived.

Desperate and struggling to survive, Tatiana met some students from Mission Eurasia's School Without Walls (SWW) leadership training program who brought her food and warm clothes for the winter. They also gave her a New Testament. That began Tatiana's dramatic transformation. "Realizing that my life was falling into an abyss of hopelessness, I decided to read the New Testament that the SWW students gave me," she recalls. "I got so caught up in what I was reading, that I couldn't stop! I also started praying for peace for my country, and prosperity, not only for my family, but throughout the world. And then God started communicating with me through the positive changes He brought about in my life. I now believe that He will take care of us."
